Our Foundation works with community to support, advocate and advance healthier lives for everyone.

In 2023, 72 Massachusetts organizations received grants totaling \$3.8M+.

Highlights:

- \$90,000 two-year general operating grant to **Mandela Yoga Project** in Boston to pilot a scalable system of free peer-led yoga as a tool of self-healing in communities experiencing racism and other systemic barriers.
- \$200,000 two-year general operating grant to **La Colaborativa** to uplift communities by partnering with Latine immigrants in Chelsea and other Gateway Cities to drive policy and system change with a focus on food and housing security, economic advancement, leadership development, and cultural celebration.
- \$70,000 one-year general operating grant to **Massachusetts Food System Collaborative**, an organization that builds capacity of food system stakeholders to create systemic change to ensure an equitable, sustainable, resilient and connected food system.
- \$70,000 two-year general operating grant to **OUTstandingLIFE**, an organization growing the capacity to create virtual programming to address loneliness and social isolation among LGBTQ+ older adults.
- \$94,600 one-year grant to **Public Health Institute of Western Massachusetts** in Springfield to advocate for increased access to affordable housing and other resources for older adults with a past criminal record.
