

Designated Network for Transplants

Our transplant network specifies designated provider hospitals for organ and blood cell transplantation. All potential organ transplant candidates must be referred within our transplant network. The Tufts Health Plan transplant care manager collaborates with physicians, transplant centers, and other providers to help coordinate high quality care for members who need transplants.

Certification/Accreditation Requirements

- **For solid organ transplants**, members must receive care at a transplant facility approved by Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). - **For cellular transplants (stem cell/bone marrow)**, members must receive care at a facility accredited by The Foundation for the Accreditation of Cellular Therapy (FACT). FACT-accredited facilities can be found using the following link: <https://accredited.factglobal.org/>
- **Facilities** must have a contract in place with Tufts Health Plan.
