Our Foundation works with community to support, advocate and advance healthier lives for everyone.

In 2023, 27 Rhode Island organizations received grants totaling nearly \$1.35M.

Highlights:

- \$90,000 two-year general operating grant to **Pocasset Pokanoket Land Trust** to support culturally appropriate food access program for Indigenous communities in Rhode Island.
- \$225,000 three-year general operating grant to **Rhode Island Coalition to End Homelessness** to advance solutions to prevent and end homelessness including increased access to permanent supportive housing for older Rhode Islanders.
- \$50,000 one-year general operating grant to **Hope's Harvest** invests in their capacity to harvest surplus produce from farms and contract with local growers for distribution to hunger relief agencies.
- \$80,000 two-year general operating grant to **Providence Streets Coalition** to advance "Safe Streets for All" policies to improve safety, equity, sustainability, health and quality of life for older adults in Providence.
- \$50,000 two-year general operating grant to **Women's Refugee Care** to develop support groups where refugee women can share experiences, process trauma and access other resources.
